



Majority of Americans Support Impeachment (c3)

Since returning to office, the MAGA regime and its billionaire allies have taken aggressive actions that many view as a hostile takeover of our government institutions. These actions include repeated violations of our constitutional rights and disregard for the fundamental principles of liberty and justice for all. Most Americans see impeachment as the legitimate and necessary response to defend the Constitution and protect democratic governance.

Key Findings

A majority of likely voters support impeaching Trump (52%), including a majority of independents (55%). Support is also strong among Democratic voters (84%), and a fifth of Republican voters (20%) also support this move.¹

Several members of Congress have recently come out in support of impeaching President Trump for violating Americans' constitutional rights and the law. To what extent do you support or oppose President Trump being impeached?



- The vast majority of those who support impeachment do so strongly (71%), while 29% support impeachment somewhat.
- Voters of color are the strongest supporters of impeachment, with 66% of Latinos and 65% of Black voters endorsing this move, compared to 47% of white voters.
- Nearly half of likely voters (46%) believe Congress has a duty to pursue impeachment, including 80% of Democratic voters and 52% of independents.¹
 - Fewer than a fifth (17%) want Congress to refrain from impeachment out of concern that it would fail, seem performative, or politically damage its supporters. The other two-fifths (38%) reject the idea that any impeachable offenses have occurred.
- Support for impeachment is now on par with the levels seen during the two most recent impeachment proceedings — even before a full public case has been presented. .² This moment offers an opportunity to build that case for the American public and demonstrate that

elected leaders are committed to upholding their oaths and are willing to act boldly to protect our freedoms, our families, and our futures.
