
Re: Findings from Recent Swing District Poll

Date: September 18, 2025

A new Lake Research Partners poll, commissioned by Free Speech For People, of likely 2026 voters in swing Congressional districts reveals a plurality of swing-district voters support the impeachment of **President Donald Trump.** It is remarkable and, as far as we know, unprecedented for such a large proportion of voters in swing districts to support impeachment of a president in the first year of his term.


Nearly half of voters in swing districts (49%) support President Trump being impeached, while 44% are opposed. Voters feel strongly about this issue on both sides – 45% strongly support impeachment and 42% strongly oppose. An overwhelming majority of Democrats support impeachment (82% support, 10% oppose) as well as a plurality of independents (48% support, 42% oppose). Republicans largely oppose impeachment (10% support, 86% oppose).

A solid majority of swing-district voters (56%) disapprove of the job Donald Trump is doing as president, while 40% approve. Again, these ratings are very polarized, with a clear majority who strongly disapprove (54%) and 35% who strongly approve. Democrats nearly universally give President Trump a negative job rating (5% approve, 93% disapprove), as do a majority of independents (33% approve, 55% disapprove), while among Republicans 84% approve and 14% disapprove. Fundamentally, this President is very unpopular in swing districts.

¹Lake Research Partners designed and administered this survey, which was conducted by live telephone (cell and landline) interviews and text-to-online from a sample of 800 likely 2026 voters in AZ-01, AZ-06, CA-13, CA-45, CO-08, IA-01, ME-02, MI-07, NC-01, NM-02, NY-04, OH-09, OH-13, PA-07, PA-10, WA-03, and WI-03. The survey was conducted September 8-14, 2025. Data were weighted slightly by gender, age, race/ethnicity, region, educational attainment, and partisanship to reflect the expected demographic composition of likely voters in these districts. The margin of error for the full sample is +/-3.5%.
