

Impeachment Talking Points and FAQ

TALKING POINTS

1. PROBLEM

- a. Leading up to and during his second presidential term, Trump has carried out an assault on the rule of law, on the checks and balances of power between our co-equal branches of government, and on the Constitution, **committing hundreds of impeachable offenses, which we have grouped into 27 categories of offenses.** These repeated abuses of power clearly violate constitutional commands at the expense of our democratic institutions, constitutional precedent, and the health and safety of the people, especially our most marginalized communities.
- b. On Day One of Trump's second administration, Congress should have opened an impeachment investigation into Trump's violations of the Emoluments Clauses and into his unlawful, corrupt campaign practices. Since taking office, Trump has committed a growing list of impeachable offenses. Unless and until Congress takes its constitutional impeachment obligations seriously, Trump will continue to entrench his corrupt interests, usurp authority committed by the Constitution to other government branches, and abuse his power to the detriment of our democracy and the people of our country.

2. SOLUTION / DEMAND:

- a. In our Constitution, there is one remedy for high crimes committed by a President: impeachment.
- b. Members of Congress also took an oath of allegiance to and defense of the Constitution. Each member who protects Trump from impeachment violates that oath of office.
- c. Trump is not a monarch. He is beholden to the Constitution, as is Congress. And as the Framers understood, if we are to preserve our democracy for the people, then Congress has a duty to investigate, impeach and remove a corrupt executive. Congress must take action and impeach and remove Trump immediately from public office for offenses that he has committed against the people, institutions, and branches of our government.

3. CALL TO ACTION

- a. Congress will only act if there is a mandate from the American people. It is up to all of us to ensure that every single one of our representatives does their job.
- b. Call and email the offices of our House representatives and tell them that we demand that Trump be held accountable for his abuses of power and that he be impeached and removed, as well as other key Trump officials. A majority of Americans support impeaching Trump, including a plurality of swing-district voters, but our representatives need to hear the mandate directly from their constituents.
- c. Join 1M+ people across the country by signing the petition at [ImpeachTrumpAgain.org](#).
- d. Call on members of Congress to introduce articles of impeachment against Trump and force more floor votes on impeachment in the House. Any member of Congress has the

power to introduce articles of impeachment and force a floor vote in the House. We need **218 members** in the House to impeach Trump and advance articles of impeachment to the Senate for a trial on Trump’s high crimes. Rep. Al Green of Texas invoked this power in [June 2025](#) and [December 2025](#), and **140 members** have now voted in support of advancing impeachment. Rep. John Larson filed 13 articles of impeachment against Trump on April 7, 2026, citing an “unhinged” response to Middle East conflicts and accusing Trump of violating war powers, conducting illegal detentions, and endangering national security.

“As a constituent of Rep. [MEMBER OF CONGRESS], I am calling on you to support the impeachment and removal of President Donald Trump for his grave abuses of power. In the last impeachment vote, Rep. [MEMBER OF CONGRESS] voted [AGAINST/FOR] Trump’s impeachment. There will be another impeachment vote against Trump, and I am calling on [MEMBER OF CONGRESS] to do their job, uphold the Constitution, and vote for impeachment during the next vote. I also call on Rep. [MEMBER OF CONGRESS] to introduce their own articles of impeachment against President Trump and force a floor vote.”

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ)

- ***Why pursue impeachment if it hasn’t led to conviction previously, and some may say we don’t have the congressional makeup to compel impeachment or removal?***
 - Our goal is removal - not just impeachment. Impeachment is not a symbolic act. This is the democratic process outlined in our Constitution to remove an unlawful, dangerous president from power. We either have a Constitution, or we don’t. We normalize Trump’s abuses of power when we do not name them for what they are: High Crimes against the state for which he must be impeached and removed from public office. Impunity is emboldening.
 - The House of Representatives must vote by a simple majority, **218 votes**, to impeach the President. Then the Senate holds a trial to convict. To be convicted and removed from office, two-thirds of the Senate must vote in favor. While Trump has twice been impeached, both times he was acquitted by the Senate. This term, Trump’s abuses of power are already so numerous and so serious that any trial in the Senate would make it abundantly clear why he is a threat to our republic and must be removed from public office. Still, we must mobilize to build our case and increase public pressure on members of Congress to fulfill their constitutional duty now.
 - We all want this tyrannical administration to be removed, which requires a movement powerful enough to impeach and remove Trump. Movements don’t just happen; they’re built. We are committed to building that necessary movement; we invite you to join us.
- ***Republicans have the majority and have captured all three branches of government. How is impeachment possible?***
 - We need to build the case for impeachment now. If we do not build it now, we will not be in a position to advance impeachment when the votes are there. Impeachment is not, and

should not, be a partisan affair. All members of Congress and judicial officers have sworn an oath to protect and defend the Constitution, which supersedes any party affiliation or political jockeying. Republican members of Congress have voted for Trump's impeachment and removal in the past. We must build a strong enough movement to pressure members of Congress, including members of the President's party, to abide by their oath at this critical moment in our history.

- ***Why are you only campaigning for Trump's impeachment and not other members of the administration?***
 - We *are* campaigning for the impeachment and removal of other members of the Trump administration. Many Trump officials have committed impeachable abuses of power and must be held accountable. Free Speech For People has described the impeachable offenses of key Trump officials [HERE](#).
- ***Why call for impeachment and removal instead of calling to invoke the 25th Amendment?***
 - To remove a president under the 25th Amendment, the vice president must submit a written declaration to Congress with the support from a majority of cabinet secretaries. If such a declaration were disputed, which Trump almost certainly would, Congress would still have to approve the removal with a two-thirds voting threshold in both houses.
 - While we would support the removal of Trump via the 25th Amendment, Vice President Vance and a majority of Trump's cabinet are highly unlikely to take this action. And though the 25th Amendment includes an option for the ability to remove the president to lie with "such other body as Congress may by law provide," such a body does not currently exist, and congressional action would be required to create such a body.
 - A 25th Amendment removal also would not address the many constitutional offenses Trump has committed. Congress should not try to abdicate its constitutional responsibility to impeach by searching for short cuts to remove Trump. The process for impeaching and removing a president is entirely within Congress's power, and we the people must demand that members of Congress carry out their sworn duty to protect the Constitution and launch impeachment proceedings against this lawless president.
- ***Isn't Trump protected by a corrupt Supreme Court? How can he be impeached?***
 - The Supreme Court has no authority to review a decision by Congress to exercise its exclusive power to impeach and remove a president. The Chief Justice presides over presidential impeachment trials in the Senate, but all procedural rulings are still subject to the will of the Senate majority. The Chief Justice has no say in the outcome of the trial.
- ***If Trump is removed, wouldn't Vice President Vance become President?***
 - Vance can also be impeached and removed for any abuses of power he has committed. If Trump is successfully impeached and removed, Congress must hold Vance to the same standard - if he has violated the Constitution and commits high crimes, he too must be impeached and removed.
